Meet Blessed Carlo Acutis

Blessed Carlo Acutis was born on May 3, 1991 in London, England to Italian parents. During his childhood, the family returned to Italy, settling in Milan. Carlo was an engaging child, and at a very early age, he exhibited a radical love for his Catholic faith, especially for the Eucharist. Carlo said, "To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan." Carlo attended daily Mass most of his life. At the age of 15, Carlo became ill with what his family initially thought was influenza. Several of his classmates and friends were also home from school with illness. However, when his condition didn't improve within a week, his mother took him to the doctor. Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia, and he would succumb to the disease within one week of the diagnosis, on October 12, 2006. As he lay dying, Carlo bravely said, "I'm happy to die because I've lived my life without wasting even a minute of it doing things that wouldn't have pleased God."

A first-class relic of Carlo Acutis kicked off the Eucharistic Revival last Sunday on the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. The relic will make a three-year journey to every diocese in the United States. Let's ponder Carlo's radical love of the Eucharist, and may the same be said of each one of us.


