## **The Pastor's Toolbox**

### ECUMENICAL COUNCIL OF JERUSALEM

Paul started a firestorm when he began accepting converts into the church. He did not insist that they first become Jews. The conservatives within Christianity saw this as a dangerous break from tradition. In particular they demanded that new conversions be accompanied by circumcision--a painful rite in those days before anesthetics.

The turmoil led to what has been called, "the first Ecumenical Council". The meeting probably took several weeks. We see only the start and the end. Essentially, the liberal wing won the day. The Council sent a letter to gentile Christians approving the new policy. It provoked great joy and a wave of new conversions.

### I AM GOING AWAY

At the Last Supper Jesus announced that he was "going away." The Church interprets this as a reference to the Ascension. Where, exactly, did Jesus go and why? The people of the Middle East took things literally. They believed that heaven was somewhere beyond the sky--which they thought was a dome above the earth. Jesus did not come to teach astronomy, so he rose up into the sky as a way of saying that he was going to something "greater".

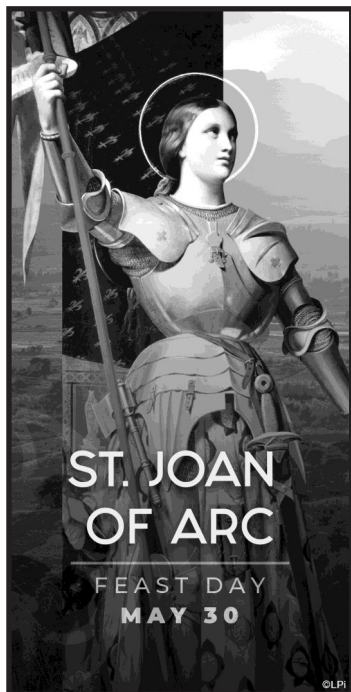
Why did he leave? He was probably teaching that his followers should no longer look for physical apparitions. He would remain spiritually with them through his Holy Spirit. This would force the disciples to begin their mission to "go out to all the world and preach the good news." They will love others as Jesus loves them.

### GROWING IN OUR FAITH

## Rescued: The Unexpected and Extraordinary News of the Gospel



Throughout my years of ministry, I have recommended several books on various topics such as apologetics, scripture, the Mass, and the saints, just to name a few. I have recommended books for the young, the newly initiated, and adults, all who desire to learn more about their Catholic faith.

Many of the books which I have read have affected me, but if I could make only one recommendation, the one title which I would recommend would be Fr. John Riccardo's *Rescued: The Unexpected and Extraordinary News of the Gospel* (The Word Among Us Press, 2020). Fr.

John Riccardo has long influenced me and, by extension, my service to the Church, but this book changed *everything* for me. I purchased *Rescued* in 2021 to read during Lent, and it didn't disappoint. In fact, it renewed my heart and spirit in ways I *never* would have imagined. It opened my eyes to see myself as God sees me, or perhaps better written, to see the person He created me to be. I was reminded of the words of St. Catherine of Siena: "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire." The overarching theme of his book is proclaiming the Kerygma. (This is also the

mission of his ministry, Acts XXIX ([www.actsxxix.org](http://www.actsxxix.org)). You can discover much more on the website.) *Kerygma*, simply defined, is the proclamation of the Gospel, the Good News. In *Rescued*, Fr. John Riccardo breaks open the Gospel message under these four subheadings: *Created, Captured, Rescued, Response*. In this dynamic retelling of Salvation History, Fr. John Riccardo concludes, "The rescued *rescue*." In baptism we become sharers in God's plan of salvation. Paraphrasing a quote from St. Joan of Arc, Fr. John often encourages us in this mission:

*Do not be afraid. God is with you, and you were born for this.*

You and I were born for *this time*. I encourage everyone to read *Rescued*, visit the website for Acts XXIX, or listen to the podcast, *You Were Born for This*, and prepare to be strengthened and transformed to meet the challenges before the Church today.
