Change of Heart

John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Mark 1:4).

The advice we receive is often predetermined by our choice of advisor. Those who made the journey into the desert to hear John the Baptist did not expect to hear soft words. They knew they would be challenged by his message, that he was fearless in denouncing injustice and sin. So bold was he that he pointed an accusatory finger even at King Herod Antipas, and was murdered for his trouble. Beneath the specific sins he railed against was a fundamental attitude of resistance to grace. That is why John the Baptist called for a change of heart, a theme Jesus himself used in his early preaching.

Placing the figure of John the Baptist before us in Advent, the Church repeats this summons to repentance and change of heart. We can all too easily become hardhearted by too much soft living. Our sense of sin becomes dulled to the point that we lose the capacity to distinguish between good and evil. Has this not already happened in television and the entertainment industry as a whole? We, too, may need to take more seriously our call to holiness, to live our lives in a manner befitting our Christian vocation and perhaps embrace a simpler or even more austere lifestyle. Do we really need to watch the next program or see the latest film? Such practical conversions are essential to effect a change of heart and prepare ourselves to welcome our coming Savior.
