Questions of the Week Inspiring Us to Live in the Holy Spirit

<u>Adults:</u> Do I get distracted by the voices of false shepherds? What helps me focus more on the voice of the Good Shepherd?

<u>Children:</u> How do I know that Jesus, the Good Shepherd, is protecting and guiding me? When do I feel his love and care the most?



The Good Shepherd

The fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday, because the Gospel for each year of the Lectionary comes from the tenth chapter of Saint John, in which Jesus speaks of himself as the Good Shepherd. Jesus says that he knows his sheep and that they follow him because he "give[s] them eternal life, and they shall never perish" (John 10:28).

If we're not careful, the images of the shepherd and of knowing can be lost on us in today's modern, fast-paced society. The shepherd would put his very life on the line for his sheep. Their well-being, their safety, and providing for their needs were the shepherd's chief responsibility. Elsewhere in John's tenth chapter, Jesus says that "a good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:1).

To know, in the biblical sense, is much deeper and more personal than in the sense with which we may use it today. In the biblical sense, to know something or someone is to have an intimate, personal experience of the thing or person that is known. In the Bible, to know someone is to be in relationship with that person.

In the Gospel today, Jesus says that he knows his sheep. It is in this deeply profound, relational way that he speaks of us—the sheep for whom he has laid down his life. On this Fourth Sunday of Easter we continue to celebrate the great love of God shown to us in the Paschal Mystery. In this we, the members of Christ's Body, find our hope and our strength.-




